NARROW BAND COMMUNICATIONS EXEMPTION APPLICATION DEADLINE

All EMS Services operating on 150-174 MHz and 421-512 MHz radio bands must meet the January 1, 2012 deadline to convert to the narrow band operation or submit a waiver to allow the service more time to comply.
